

COIN HOARDS FROM THE BRITISH ISLES 2019

EDITED BY MURRAY ANDREWS AND ELEANOR GHEY

BETWEEN 1975 and 1985 the Royal Numismatic Society published summaries of coin hoards from the British Isles and elsewhere in its serial publication *Coin Hoards*, and in 1994 this was revived as a separate section in the *Numismatic Chronicle*. In recent years the listing of finds from England, Wales and Northern Ireland in *Coin Hoards* was principally derived from reports originally prepared for publication in the *Treasure Annual Report*, but the last hoards published in this form were those reported under the 1996 Treasure Act in 2008. In 2012 it was decided to publish summaries of hoards from England, Wales, Scotland, the Isle of Man, Northern Ireland, the Republic of Ireland and the Channel Islands in the *British Numismatic Journal* on an annual basis.

The information provided for each hoard consists of the place of finding, the date(s) of discovery, the suggested date(s) of deposition, the number allocated to the hoard when it was reported under the terms of the Treasure Act (in England and Wales) or the laws of Treasure Trove (in Scotland), and a summary of its contents. Reports on most of the English and Welsh hoards listed are available online from the Portable Antiquities Scheme (PAS) website: select the 'Search our database' bar under finds.org.uk/database, and type in the type in the PAS database ID provided (e.g. HAMP-EAD937) or the treasure case number without spaces (e.g. 2017T132).

The listing below gives summary details of eighty-two Iron Age and Roman coin hoards reported on for the Treasure process during 2018. Full catalogues of the hoards are attached to the relevant Portable Antiquities Scheme database records (made public at the end of the Treasure process) or are available at the British Museum pending online publication. The high number of hoards listed is a reflection of the general trend of increasing numbers of hoards reported under the Treasure Act 1996 in recent years, although fewer finds were made than in 2017. This was presumably due to weather conditions affecting metal detecting activity, which accounts for the majority of cases.

The hoards include eighteen Iron Age coin hoards with a broad geographical spread. These are mostly smaller hoards, with the exception of an important hoard of 269 coins and objects found in two separate deposits in Nursling, Hampshire (no. 18) and a scattered group from Norfolk. The group includes a few mixed Iron Age and Roman hoards, with further addenda to the St Levan hoard from Cornwall (no. 24). This hoard appears to constitute a number of separate deposits over a long period and includes coinage from a number of different regional Iron Age coin traditions.

First- and second-century *denarius* hoards are well-represented this year, including a hoard of 1,055 *denarii* and 1 radiate found on a metal detecting rally in Norton, South Yorkshire dated to AD 231 (no. 53). An updated summary of the 2015 South Warwickshire II hoard is given (no. 25), as cleaning and further study at the British Museum in preparation for Treasure valuation revealed this to have a remarkable number of Civil War period coins, including one completely new type. Only five Civil War coins have been previously recorded from British hoards, making this an assemblage of international numismatic importance.

This year there have been relatively few examples of the usually common category of third-century radiate hoards. A late legitimist hoard from Ilminster (no. 59) was found a few metres away from a gold finger ring of third-century date, demonstrating the difficulties of determining associations between artefacts and coins without archaeological context. The radiate hoard from

Bourne Valley, Wiltshire (no. 57) was an example of good practice, as it was left in situ to be excavated under controlled archaeological conditions. As ever, the indefatigable British Museum conservators are to be thanked for their role in lifting, excavating and cleaning this and many other finds.

The largest Tetrarchic *nummus* hoard from recent times was found in Rauceby, Lincolnshire (no. 61). This hoard is of importance for the study of the London mint in particular. Archaeological excavation of the hoard also revealed a small, late radiate hoard placed alongside the hoard container.

Finally, the Wem, Shropshire hoard (no. 82) combined clipped *siliquae* with 182 items of hacksilver. When fully studied, this hoard promises to shed new light on the period of transition from coinage to the bullion economy.

1. Great Bromley, Essex, Oct. 2017 to Feb. 2018 (2017 T1194, 2017 T1195 and 2018 T450, addenda to finds from 2013 onwards also known as the East of Colchester II hoard)

Dep.: c.80–50 BC or later (hoard).

Contents: 1 Uninscribed insular Af2 British Iron Age quarter stater (Sills 2017, 262 no. 298, 0.9 g); 1 Eastern British Iron Age gold quarter stater of Cunobelin (*ABC* 2816, 1.3 g); 1 Gallo-Belgic DC type quarter stater (*ABC* 40, 1.47 g).

Note: PAS ID: ESS-FE6D45, ESS-FE788D and ESS-4C11C6.

The coins previously reported from this hoard consist of a mixture of imported Gallo-Belgic uninscribed quarter staters and staters and insular uninscribed quarter staters. The newly discovered uninscribed insular quarter stater is from South Western Britain, with recorded examples in Dorset, Hampshire, the Isle of Wight and West Sussex. The coin of Cunobelin is much later in date (c.AD 10–40) than the earlier finds. The circumstances of deposition of this hoard are unknown (whether a dispersed group or a series of individual deposits) and in the past there has been some confusion between spatially separate finds made by the same metal detecting group.

2. Tarrant Crawford, Dorset, July 2016 to Aug. 2017 (2018 T120)

Dep.: c.80–50 BC or later (hoard).

Contents: Uninscribed British Iron Age insular X1 stater, 2 (Sills 2017, 258 no. 290, *ABC* 94 var., 6.97 g and 6.82 g); Uninscribed British Af2 stippled Iron Age quarter stater (Sills 2017, 262 no. 298, *ABC* 2205 var., 1.30 g); Uninscribed Insular Xf2 Iron Age quarter stater, 2 (Sills 2017, 258 no. 292, *ABC* 2148 var., 1.64 g and 1.54 g).

Note: PAS ID: DOR-7D3F2C. All five coins are of types now thought to be produced in south-western Britain.

Disposition: Dorset County Museum and the British Museum hope to acquire.

3. Hoo Peninsula, Medway, Aug. 2018 (2018 T836)

Dep.: c.60–50 BC or later

Contents: 1 Gallo-Belgic Aa quarter stater (Sills 2003 Class V p. 132 no. 282; *ABC* 28, 1.65 g); 3 Gallo-Belgic E staters (Scheers class I, 6.26 g; class III, 5.95 g and class IV, 6.00 g); 2 Gallo-Belgic D quarter staters (*ABC* 43, 1.44 g and 1.43 g).

Note: PAS KENT-C7C7A1. A distorted gold ring was reported with the coins but could not be dated.

Disposition: Disclaimed.

4. Hurstbourne Tarrant, Hampshire, Nov. 2018 (2018 T1016)

Dep.: c.60–20 BC

Contents: 1 Gallo-Belgic E gold stater (*ABC* 16, Scheers class III, 6.12 g); 2 uninscribed Southern British Iron Age gold staters (*ABC* 485; Sills Qa class 1 (BMC 449), 6.17 g and Sills Qa class 2 (BMC 445), 6.12 g) (Sills 2017, 120).

Note: PAS HAMP-24A803 and LON-5321B2. One of at least five coins found on a metal-detecting rally and not declared at the time. The coins here were reported by the finders.

Disposition: To be decided.

5. Wing, Buckinghamshire, Aug. 2018 (2018 T597, addendum to 2015 T414)

Dep.: c.60–20 BC

Contents: 1 Eastern British Iron Age (North Thames) uninscribed gold stater (*ABC* 2433, 5.79 g).

Note: PAS ID: BUC-5052F2. This coin was found in the same area as a previously recorded dispersed hoard of six gold staters (BUC-D7ACBF). It is of the same type as the earlier find and shares dies with one coin from that hoard.

Disposition: Buckinghamshire County Museum hopes to acquire.

6. Bardney area, Lincolnshire, Sep. 2018 (2018 T766, addenda to 2016 T1032)

Dep.: c.60–20 BC

Contents: 2 North Eastern British Iron Age gold scyphate quarter staters (*ABC* 1773, 1.22 g and *ABC* 1770/3 var., *BMC* 3187, 1.51 g) and 1 North Eastern uninscribed gold stater (*ABC* 1716, 6.15 g).

Note: PAS ID: LIN-9B1936. These three coins are all of similar date and appear to be from the same dispersed hoard as two scyphate quarter staters of *ABC* 1773 type found in 2016 and previously declared Treasure (2016 T1032; LIN-FD23DC).

Disposition: The Collection, Lincoln and the British Museum hope to acquire.

Dep.: c.50–20 BC

Contents: 2 Western British Iron Age uninscribed silver units (*ABC* 2018), both incomplete.

Note: PAS ID: BERK-F4DF73.

8. Sturminster Marshall, Dorset, Sep. 2017 (2018 T227)

Dep.: c.50–20 BC

Contents: 2 South Western British Iron Age uninscribed silver staters (*ABC* 2169: 3.08 g and 3.32 g).

Note: PAS ID: DOR-8DDD79.

Disposition: Priest's House Museum hopes to acquire. W.P.

9. Charminster, Dorset, Sep. 2017 (2018 T676 addenda to 2015 T744)

Dep.: c.50–20 BC

Contents: 4 South Western British Iron Age uninscribed base silver staters (*ABC* 2169: 2.94 g, 2.70 g, 2.24 g and 3.12 g).

Note: PAS ID: DOR-4D5B01. The original find consisted of 26 base silver staters DOR-7951CB.

Disposition: To be decided.

10. Great Missenden, Buckinghamshire, Oct. 2017 (2017 T1021)

Dep.: c.20 BC–AD 10

Contents: 2 Eastern British (North Thames) Iron Age gold staters of Tasciovanus (*ABC* 2580: 5.40 g and 5.45 g).

Note: PAS ID: BH-E90DFA.

Disposition: Disclaimed.

11. Nursling, Hampshire, Jan. 2018 (2018 T95)

Dep.: c.20 BC–AD 10

Contents: 1 gold and 268 silver and base silver Iron Age coins and 3 artefacts, in two groups.

Deposit 1: Southern British uninscribed stater, 1 (*ABC* 746); South Western British uninscribed silver staters, 105 (*ABC* 2157 / 2169, 104; *ABC* 2163, 1); South Western British uninscribed silver quarter staters, 14 (*ABC* 2208, 6; *ABC* 2214, 3; *ABC* 2220, 5); Southern British uninscribed silver units, 35 (*ABC* 857, 3; *ABC* 872/5 var., 8; *ABC* 863, 3; *ABC* 914, 11; *ABC* 917, 8; *ABC* 929, 1; new type, 1); Southern British uninscribed silver half units, 2 (*ABC* 944 var., 1; *ABC* 968, 1); Southern British uninscribed silver minims, 8 (new Danebury style types, 5; cf *ABC* 944 var., 2; *ABC* 980, 1); 1 Southern British uninscribed silver unit (cf *ABC* 857) overstruck with Eastern British unit *ABC* 2505 type; East Wiltshire British uninscribed unit, 1 (*ABC* 2128); Western British uninscribed silver units, 2 (*ABC* 2012, 1; *ABC* 2015, 1); Eastern British uninscribed half units, 4 (*ABC* 2261, 2; *ABC* 2297, 1; plated ?half unit cf *ABC* 2505 var., 1).

Deposit 2: South Western British uninscribed silver staters, 86 (*ABC* 2157 / 2169); Southern British uninscribed silver minims attributed to Tincomarus, 2 (*ABC* 1142).

Additional finds from samples: South Western British uninscribed silver staters, 3 (*ABC* 2169); South Western British uninscribed silver quarter stater, 1 (*ABC* 2220); Southern or Eastern British uninscribed silver minim (new type), 1. Copper alloy buckle and fragments. Iron loop found corroded together with 3 South Western British uninscribed silver staters (*ABC* 2157 / 2169).

Topsoil find (about 3 m from deposit 1): Silver ingot, 528.33 g. The ingot is flat, sub-circular and compares well to similar finds from the Isle of Wight.

Note: PAS ID: WILT-A9B1FB. The initial find consisted of 173 staters and fractions with no evidence of a container. During subsequent archaeological excavation by Richard Henry, PAS volunteers and Cotswold Archaeology staff, a second group of 88 coins was found, c.7 m away from the first deposit. The coins were cleaned for identification in the conservation laboratory of the British Museum. Soil samples (mostly from deposit 1) were later processed and found to contain 8 additional coins and charcoal.

The majority of the South Western staters have signs of deliberate damage on the obverse. It is difficult to state with certainty whether this deposit is related to a large find from Upton, Hampshire made in the 1990s (de Jersey 2014 no. 113, pp. 187–95). This earlier find consists of a group of coins reported as potential Treasure in 1995 and what seems to be a much larger, undeclared find from 1997.

Disposition: St. Barbe Museum hope to acquire.

12. Kilsby, Northamptonshire, Feb. 2018 (2018 T182)

Dep.: 2 BC–AD 4 or later.

Contents: 1 cut quarter of a silver *denarius* of Augustus (*RIC* 207).

Note: PAS ID: NARC-2671D8. The fact that the coin has been cut in an intentional manner suggests its re-use as bullion etc. It therefore qualifies as Treasure under the stipulations of the Treasure Act 1996.

Disposition: Acquired by Daventry Museum.

13. Tenterden area, Kent, Nov. 2017 (2018 T534)

Dep.: 2 BC–AD 4 or later.

Contents: 2 *denarii*: Republic, 1 (*RRC* 463/3, fragmentary) and Augustus, 1 (*RIC* 207).

Note: PAS ID: PUBLIC-C8ECEA and PUBLIC-C9A890.

Disposition: Disclaimed.

14. Near Cookley, Suffolk, Jul. 2018 (2018 T1058, addenda to 2017 T720)

Dep.: 2 BC–AD 4 or later (original find).

Contents: 3 Roman Republican *denarii*: *RRC* 328/1, 341/1 and 532/1.

Note: PAS ID: SF-CD1FD6. Addenda to find of 12 *denarii*, SF-1FC3B8.

Disposition: Halesworth Museum hopes to acquire.

Dep.: c.AD 10–40 (latest deposit)

Contents: 8 Iron Age coins: 1 Gallo-Belgic D quarter stater (*ABC* 43, 1.4 g); 1 Gallo-Belgic E stater (Scheers class III, *ABC* 16; VA 54.1, 6.09 g); 1 cut half of an uninscribed Eastern British Iron Age silver unit of the North Thames and Kent region (*ABC* 2625, 0.36 g); 1 inscribed British Iron Age Kent copper-alloy unit of Eppillus (*ABC* 411, 1.49 g); 1 inscribed British Iron Age Kent copper-alloy unit of Dubnovellaunos (*ABC* 342,

2.41 g); 1 uninscribed Eastern British Iron Age copper-alloy unit attributed to Tasciovanus (*ABC* 2682, 1.61 g); 2 uninscribed Eastern British Iron Age copper alloy units of Cunobelin (*ABC* 2975, 2.06 g and *ABC* 2921, 2.07 g).

Note: PAS ID: KENT-032C0A. It is suggested that the coins may represent two separate episodes of deposition at the same site. The halved unit appears to have been deliberately cut.

Disposition: The British Museum hopes to acquire one coin.

Note: PAS ID: NARC-76492A.

Disposition: Disclaimed.

Dep.: c.AD 20–45.

Contents: 2 Western British Iron Age gold staters inscribed CORIO (*ABC* 2048 var., 5.55 g and *ABC* 2048, 5.54 g); 1 plated Western British gold stater inscribed EISV (cf *ABC* 2078); 9 Western British uninscribed silver units (*ABC* 2012, 1; *ABC* 2015, 2; *ABC* 2018, 1; cf *ABC* 2018, 1; cf *ABC* 2021, 1; *ABC* 2027, 1; uncertain type cf *ABC* 2015ff, 1; plated copy of *ABC* 2018ff, 1); 1 Uncertain Western? plated silver unit or half unit; 1 base metal core, possibly of a Western plated silver unit; 1 North Eastern British uninscribed silver half unit (cf *ABC* 1833).

Note: PAS ID: HESH-44097D. The coins were reported with 1 East Anglian quarter stater (*ABC* 1480, 1.03 g) and 3 East Anglian inscribed silver units of uncertain type. Due to doubts surrounding the circumstances of discovery these are not thought to be from the same find.

Disposition: Shropshire Museums hope to acquire part.

Note: PAS ID: NMS-517306. These coins are addenda to an earlier (1980s) find of Iron Age coins. A group of *denarii* from the same field were reported separately as 2014 T111 (see no. 36 below). The coins can be considered to be part of a scattered area of unusually intense deposition, possibly consisting of a number of discrete deposits made at the same site in separate episodes over a period of time and since scattered by the plough.

However, the composition of the group seen is unusual for a hoard of coins buried in the AD 290s, in that the later, post AD 274 reform radiates are very poorly represented indeed, even despite their relative rarity when compared to the radiates of the Gallic Empire. It is therefore probable that the original find was larger than this and contained more of these later coins.
